This report highlights the achievements and challenges over the last year. Our aspiration is to “deliver the best for residents” and support our residents in staying as independent as possible.

When people become less independent or unwell, we want to ensure they can access care and support at the right time and in the right place.

We do this by supporting people at home or in a home-like setting wherever possible and having positive conversations about what they can do for themselves and their ambitions, rather than focussing on what is not going so well in their life. We will work in partnership with residents, their families and local communities to find solutions before introducing council services.

83% of people needed less care or no care at all after receiving an enablement service

97% people aged 65 and over remain in their home 91 days after hospital discharge

97% of people's outcomes were achieved as a result of a safeguarding enquiry
