## Your ward councillor report

Planning updates Your ward councillors successfully opposed plans to redevelop land in Jaggard Way which could have led to the loss of many small businesses and we'll continue to lobby for the best outcome here. We also assisted residents concerned about an overbearing development behind Ravenstone Street which was rejected too.

Chestnut Grove safety We are pushing for improved road safety outside Chestnut Grove Academy. Road surfaces are being improved, lines repainted, safety rails moved to better locations and street clutter removed. We will also soon be presenting a petition for further traffic calming measures.

20mph zones Now that all residential streets in the borough have a 20mph speed limit, we are actively supporting police efforts to encourage drivers to slow down. We've organised nearly 40 speedwatch sessions — more than any other ward - with more in the pipeline. Please contact us if you think your road needs attention.

Supporting our Jewish residents The council has unanimously approved the adoption of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance's formal definition of anti-Semitism. This is of particular importance to the residents of Nightingale House, which provides high quality social care for our elderly Jewish residents.

**Bellevue Road facelift** This popular shopping parade is being upgraded with new paving, more trees, better lighting, additional pedestrian safety measures and improved shop forecourts.

**Dalebury Road parking** We have successfully pressed to have parking control hours extended so that local residents can park more easily in their own road.

Roads and pavements upgraded As a result of our lobbying, these roads have all had new pavements or resurfacing: Boundaries, Ouseley, Althorp, Wiseton, Nottingham, Sarsfeld, Hendham, Dalebury, Crockerton, Calbourne, Gosberton and Tantallon.

Working with the police Councillors continue to work closely with our Safer Neighbourhoods police team and we have plans to reinvigorate the neighbourhood watch system in our ward.

Dog mess No-one likes to see it in our streets or parks so to discourage careless/selfish owners we asked the borough's dog wardens to put up eye-catching posters to tackle this problem. We are encouraging residents to help us identify culprits who don't clear up after their pets.
