Your ward councillor report

Lavender Hill The entire length of this important road in the heart of the ward has now been repaved and repaired. A large chunk of the funding came from Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy (NCIL), which is money paid by property developers to fund improvements that benefit the wider community.

20mph speed limit This lower speed limit has now been introduced across the entire borough, including in all the residential streets in our part of Battersea, except for major roads. As well as making streets quieter and safer for all, it also boosts air quality. Targeted enforcement of the new lower limit will be carried out by the police.

LED street lighting This is being gradually introduced with Mysore Road among the first to benefit. It's far more energy efficient and the bulbs last longer than the existing lights so will save council taxpayers' money and help the environment.

Culvert Road New paving and better lighting has been introduced here to make the area safer and more welcoming.

Lavender Gardens A new LED light has already been installed to light the path through to Asda. The next stage will be to replace the stairs with a ramp.

Battersea Arts Centre More NCIL money has been identified and set aside to refurbish the pavements around the restored Battersea Arts Centre before it fully reopens next year.

Lavender Hill police station Plans have just been announced by the Mayor to close a number of police stations across London including Lavender Hill. Your ward councillors are far from being convinced by these proposals and will be rigorously scrutinising the plans.

Battersea Park boost A new £150,000 children's playground has just opened in the park as part of an £840,000 programme of investment, most of which came from staging Formula E there for two years, which raised £500,000 for park improvements plus £2.5m for other frontline local services.
