Your ward councillor report

Freeing up West Hill roads Several narrow roads in the ward, which have been difficult to get through owing to parking, are being freed up by the introduction of additional yellow lines, though of course this will be done in such a way as to minimise the loss of parking for local residents.

Burglars being foiled To help combat the risk of burglary, successful negotiations have been held with Smartwater for a reduced price on their anti-theft system which allows residents to mark valuable items with a unique fluid that cannot be washed off and means if recovered by the police can be returned to its rightful owners – and help provide the evidence to prosecute those who steal or handle stolen goods. This should act as a major deterrent to would-be burglars in the area.

Eyesore's days are numbered Works should begin on the derelict petrol station in Wimbledon Park Road before the end of the year, which is being converted into a new supermarket and flats. It was been an eyesore for several years and will not be missed. However there is concern about the future of the Post Office and it is proving difficult to find a business which can take it on when the current postmaster retires.

Slowing down the speedsters The new 20 mph zone and the 'smiley face' enforcement cameras on Wimbledon Park Road are having some benefit, though cars still travel too fast in too many places. There have been four 'Community Road Watch' events to monitor vehicle speeds and hopefully word will get round that speeding tickets are a real possibility to those who flout the lower speed limit.
