Your ward councillor report

Housing in Tooting Tooting is home to lots of private rented and council housing and it's important that all these homes are maintained well and that their tenants get a fair deal. Do you think the council is doing a good job? What could be done better? Housing is a major issue and it's important that everyone has an affordable, safe, secure and well-maintained home to live in.

Fishponds playing fields Your local councillors have managed to arrange trial openings of Fishponds Playing fields on Hebdon Road. It's a large green space — the only one in Tooting. Have you been to visit and would you like to see the opening made permanent?

Local projects The tax on new developments has generated a sum of money that can be spent locally in Tooting. This can be used to fund small, one-off projects that benefit the local community. Have you any thoughts on what we could use it for? We're keen to hear your ideas.

Tooting TfL pedestrian pilot Transport for London is planning to invest around £4 million in safety improvements on the High Street and at Tooting Broadway's busy junction. Your local ward councillors have seen some early plans and there will be a full public consultation in May 2018. Have you any thoughts to add on this?

Safe Zones near schools Local people have told us of their worries about traffic near schools and their concerns about primary age children walking safely to and from school each day. What are your views about 'Safe Zones' near all primary schools, with minimal speed limits and anti-idling measures? And what should be done to improve air-quality in the whole area?

Fly-tipping and litter This was on the agenda two years ago at the last "let's talk" meeting and the situation does not seem to have got any better. Do you know anywhere in London that has solved the problem and are there any lessons Wandsworth could learn from other councils?
