Your ward councillor report

Yvonne Carr Centre The council recently held a public consultation on future plans for early years services. We have supported local parents who want to see an expansion of services and young children's facilities at the Yvonne Carr centre in Thessaly Road

Heating for Heathbrook We have supported a grant fund bid to upgrade the heating system at the Heathbrook Centre to make it a warmer and more welcoming place for local people to use.

Foodbank support We have worked with Wandsworth Foodbank to lobby for changes to the council's qualifying criteria policy so that the discretionary social fund is made easier to access for those who need it.

Thessaly Oasis We continue to try and get the gates opened at this small green space on the Patmore estate so that residents can relax and enjoy this little oasis in the heart of their neighbourhood.

Ravenet Street underpass Work is now underway to improve this convenient short cut and make it safer and more welcoming for pedestrians and cyclists. Your ward councillors would like to see even further lighting improvements and would support adding artistic elements to this important thoroughfare.

Call to keep crossing Councillors have lobbied TfL to keep the temporary crossing on Nine Elms Lane until the permanent crossing is installed in 2019.

Housing plea Your three Queenstown councillors will continue to argue for more social housing to be built as part of the area's regeneration.

Love Battersea Park We have negotiated with Go Ape to ensure that free tickets are available to young people who would not otherwise be able to afford them. We are also calling for the introduction of Park Run - a free community walk/run/stroll on Saturdays.
