Your ward councillor report

Fred Wells Gardens There's still a few days left (until March 24) for people to take part in a consultation on proposed improvements to Fred Wells Gardens worth £316,000. The proposals include upgrades to the playground and tennis courts. We want to make sure that this important neighbourhood green space is looked after and improved for local residents.

Protecting the Number 19 Bus Service

The council is calling on TfL to reverse its proposal to axe the number 19 bus in Battersea. The well-used route currently runs from Battersea Bridge Road to Finsbury Park, but TfL want it to operate only between Finsbury Park and Holborn. The council is asking TfL to change its mind and keep this service running to Battersea.

Battersea Church Road Following pleas from local residents the council has agreed to look at ways of reducing vehicle speeds and traffic volumes on Battersea Church Road.



Lavender Hill Police Station The council welcomes the recent announcement that Lavender Hill Police Station is to remain open after it was earmarked for closure by City Hall. Local people had expressed widespread concern at its proposed loss.

Refreshing Battersea High Street The council is planning a significant investment to improve Battersea High Street, following a detailed public consultation last year. We think the proposed changes will make the high street a more attractive and vibrant environment and help boost local businesses.
