
Residents Conference 23rd October 2024 Cost of Living



- £15m Cost of Living Programme largest in London.
 - Cost of Living Hub set up to answer calls on grants and benefits operational early on in response to the cost of living crisis October 2022 and is still operational Telephone 0808 175 3339 alongside a cost of living website.

Wandsworth Cost of Living Commission – final recommendations being implemented e.g. new Wandsworth Food Strategy to increase the provision of affordable food working in partnership with community organizations.

- Over 3 years 2022/23-2024/25 £600,000 in grants for additional staff has been given to Wandsworth Citizen's Advice.
- If residents are eligible for winter fuel payments, they need to submit their application to the DWP **BEFORE** the 21st **December 2024**.
- Wandsworth Citizen's Adviceline is on 0808 278 7833 press option 4. The Adviceline is open 10am – 4pm Monday – Friday.



- Council Tax Reduction Scheme for residents on a low income. The person responsible for the Council Tax payment can telephone 020 8871 8081 or go to the cost of living website.
- The Household Support Fund is funding provided by government to local authorities to directly help those most in need. The fund has financed Free School Meals and free school uniforms for example.



- Thinking Works have been provided with funding to enable residents to receive advice and initiatives such as radiator reflector panels, draught proofing and low energy light bulbs. Telephone Thinking Works on 0800 118 23 27.
- Community Spaces will be covered by my colleague.
- Helping People into Work Work Match offer free training and support to apply for jobs – Telephone 020 88715191.





Wellbeing and Inclusion

- Mental Health First Aid and Suicide Prevention training has been provided.
- The Wandsworth Well Family Foodbank Service provides counselling to Foodbank users.
- An Independent Domestic Violence Advocate is also being funded from the cost of living grant.
- Wandsworth Your Way mental health service has an additional staff member funded for 1 year to help with the increase in referrals to the service and the complexity of cases.


Recent campaigns

- Recent campaigns include:
 - Two rounds of Free School Meals campaigns, resulting in over 250 more children receiving Free School Meals
 - Two rounds of Pension Credit campaigns, resulting in over 200 more households receiving Pension Credit. We are currently running a third Pension Credit campaign.



Cost of Living Support Calculator

- Wandsworth Council hosts a Cost of Living Support calculator on its website. You can find this by going to wandsworth.gov.uk/hub and clicking 'View our support calculator'.

- When you fill in your details, the calculator will let you know if you are entitled to a wide range of benefits and discounts!





Money Advice Roadshows

- The first Money Advice Roadshow took place in Roehampton on 30 September.
- Residents could speak to 14 different council teams and local organisations, including the Housing Register team, Work Match and Citizens Advice.
- We're looking to schedule further roadshows and link up with other council teams' events within the next few months.

Money Advice Casework

- We're exploring different ways to help residents access and navigate the support they need.
- In the new year, we are aiming to pilot a casework approach to supporting residents. This means working with one-on-one with residents to understand their situations and help put them in touch with different teams and services who can support them.
- We are aiming to trial this approach with a small group of residents at first, to learn how we can use this approach most effectively. If the initial trial is successful, we can expand it to work with more residents.

Why we're doing this



There are is an increasing number of households in Wandsworth struggling with life's basics



The latest data from schools shows that 29% of our school population are eligible for free school meals.



Over 10,000
households earn less
than £20,000 a year
meaning a family,
without additional
help, will not be able
to pay annual rent on
a two-bed flat in the
borough.



Areas in
Roehampton,
Latchmere and
Tooting are
amongst the most
deprived in the
country.



Data shows a 7-year gap in male life expectancy between most and least deprived areas and a 6.2-year gap in female life expectancy between most and least deprived areas.



What we've done so far

- Residents who receive various meanstested benefits can enjoy free access to council gyms and swimming pools.
- We've continued our School Uniform support scheme which supported over 1000 individuals last year.
- We are providing many Battersea firework tickets at a reduced price for eligible residents.
- By July of this year, we had 30,000 bookings by eligible residents for free gym and swim at our sports and leisure centres.





What we will do next

Build Britain's best concessionary scheme package – across all our charging services



Developing innovative services and offers that remove barriers to access. This could be through introducing free sports kit, improving access to transport or childcare.



Implement wrap around support that will empower residents



Working with partners and businesses in Wandsworth to develop a comprehensive offer
