Your ward councillor report

Support for EU residents We've championed the council-funded partnership with Citizens Advice Wandsworth that's providing EU nationals with information and advice on their residency status. Wandsworth has a rich history of welcoming new communities and we're determined to maintain that tradition.

Delivering new facilities Several local improvement projects that we backed, worth over £750,000, are now complete. These include better drainage for Wandsworth Common's sports pitches, improvements at the Regenerate-RISE day centre at St Michael's and an upgrade to the ball games area near Chivalry Road. Refurbishment of the adjacent playground at Chivalry Road is now complete and will be followed by similar works at the Boutflower Road playground near St Mark's.

Hundreds now using the 'Report It' App Local people have embraced the 'Wandsworth Report It' app for smartphones which makes it easy to report neighbourhood problems like flytipping, graffiti and other environmental issues. It's available to download at the Apple, Android or Windows app store and if you

don't have a smartphone you can still report such issues via phone, email or online.

Successful 20mph campaign We successfully petitioned the council to include both Northcote Road and Bolingbroke Grove in the 20mph zone in its review of the policy. Look out for a consultation on both roads in the coming months.

Petition to improve busy junction We have gathered a huge number of signatures on a petition to lobby the Mayor and TfL for improvements to the crossing at the junction of Battersea Rise and Northcote Road to make it safer for pedestrians.

Northcote's going electric As part of wider efforts to improve local air quality levels, electric vehicle charging points have been installed in many street lights across Northcote at the request of residents. Dozens more are to be installed in the coming months.

A greener Northcote We've planted 45 new street trees in the ward over the last two years, enriching our neighbourhoods and ensuring they remain green and leafy. People who are interested in becoming a tree warden can email Wandtreeward@aol.com.
