




Kersfield Estate

Existing Site

This part of the Kersfield Estate has 3 deck access blocks with gardens at the rear of each, and blank gables to north and south. The landscape has many mature trees, but is often poorly overlooked due to the arrangement of the blocks. Car parking is arranged at the north of the estate onto Lytton Grove.




















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Kersfield Estate Scheme Proposal

On the Kersfield Estate we are proposing to add new buildings which range from 2 - 4 storeys. Some buildings are added to the ends of the existing buildings, and a new block is proposed near to Rosbury

Precedent: Simple, considered brickwork elevations








- Making the landscape nicer to use with new sitting and play places along the footpath







residents









Proposed Options for the Courtyards
