We will be the greenest council in inner London by 2030



Over 40% of the borough's carbon emissions come from domestic energy use

WHY IS GREENING YOUR HOME IMPORTANT?



Energy use in the home is a big part of the whole borough's carbon emissions.

Carbon emissions come from the generation of electricity we use to power our homes and the burning of gas to heat them

By making our homes energy efficient we reduce the amount of fossil fuels needed, so reducing carbon emissions. By purchasing renewable electricity and replacing gas as a heating source we can reduce them even further
